We encourage them to set their own objectives and support them to monitor their progress towards these goals. Strategies such as strength cards are used so that children and young people can identify their skills as well as areas for development. Our work concentrates on finding, building and celebrating successes in children's lives'.

Hedgehog Project

The hedgehog Project began last Monday when Dr Tara Piri from the University of Surrey came, bringing with her 20 hedgehog tunnels which, after an assembly explaining to the children what we were doing and why, she helped set up in the woodland area. The children visit each day to see if there are any footsteps in the inked paper carefully positioned inside the tunnels but so far nothing. The children however, remain optimistic so we are extending the project for another week in the hope of attracting at least one spiky little visitor. In the meantime, the foxes are enjoying the hedgehog food!

Reminders (I apologise for repeating myself again)

Could I ask you please to **not** let your children on the play equipment before school. I know that this is difficult but it has caused some upset with children wanting to be early so that they have time to play and children not wanting to get off until they have finished playing. If we remind them not to do it and you remind them that we have said this it may be possible to avoid upsets which can have a negative effect on the whole day.

At the risk of sounding like a complete nag could I please ask you not to allow children to walk on the wall between the play equipment and the building. We do not allow it during the day as it is quite high and could lead to serious injury.

Jewellery

Please remember that jewellery must not be worn in school with the exception of pierced earrings, which must be removed at home on PE/Sports/Dance days. This is not peculiar to our school; you will find this message in most school newsletters and websites.

If your child wears a hair band, please make sure it is small, plain and inconspicuous (no cats ears, bunny ears or any other characters please).

Toys

Children are not to bring toys and other personal items into school including Push Poppers. Much learning time is lost and there is often upset as we sort out ownership issues, look for lost items and try to repair breakages.

Please may I remind you not to let your children ride cycles or scooters on the school site.
