


Our New Playground- A story in pictures!

Playing on the new playground




Easter Assembly

Foxes Assembly





Dragon Quest Reading Adventure Workshop



On Wednesday 6th March, the whole school enjoyed an immersive, escape-room style Reading Adventure Workshop by the company Subject Revolution.





In the 'Dragon Quest' adventure, the children discovered that the castle is being pestered by a troublesome baby dragon who just loves to read. The Queen appeared on screen, looking for brave volunteers to go back into the eight stories set out around the hall (including detective, adventure and magical) and reveal a spell to rid the castle of the pesky dragon. As the challenge continued, it was revealed by the magic of technology that the dragon was in our school too, visiting every classroom and getting closer and closer to the library! In an exciting race against time, the children used their phonic knowledge and decoding skills to find the words that would open the padlocks to the 8 chests. Each chest contained one word of a spell that could be cast to keep the dragon away. Finally, each team worked out the spell and saved our books from the dragon!


Thank you to all of our parents/carers for your contributions that enabled us to put on this workshop. A special thank you to the parent volunteers who came to support our children on the day.

On Friday 14th March a team of six of our children went to compete at a Primary Penathlon against five other schools. They had to compete in eight events to earn




points for their team. The six children: Frankie, Ace, Seb, River, Ajesh and Xavier did our school proud and finished runners up! We are so proud of them!

This included some Year 2 children reading to our Reception children, proudly showing off their reading skills and inspiring the younger children. Year 1 Gatton Park Trip



Last week Y1 went to Gatton Park to deepen their understanding of plants and animals. In the 'Amazing animals' workshop, children named and classified vertebrates - fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. Then, they explored boxes containing objects and information relevant to each vertebrate group like animal skulls, fish, eggs, feathers and even bats! After that, they went outside and followed a trail of clues and matched vertebrates to the best habitat.

The next workshop was 'Growing' and children had to identify flowers in the beautiful gardens of Gatton Park, find out how they grow and what they require for life. They also took part in games including 'seed hide and seek' and 'bee pollinator' where they used a pipe cleaner bee to investigate how bees and other insects pollinate plants.


It was such a beautiful day and we all loved exploring in the sunshine.

A huge thank you to Hannah Hossain for organising this event, with the help of the Church volunteers.


